From Fr Tony:

This morning, we celebrate St Luke, Evangelist and Martyr. Actually, his feast is 18th October, but I have transferred the observance to today because Luke is such a major figure. Luke is usually regarded as the patron of physicians and surgeons (reason enough to celebrate him in this parish!) and his symbol in iconography is a winged ox. There is a strong and ancient tradition that Luke was also a painter and frequently claimed as the patron saint of artists. Flemish painters of the 15th and 16th centuries depict Luke painting and icon of the Virgin. The vestments are red this morning because of a tradition that says Luke suffered martyrdom, although there is little evidence for this. It is claimed that there are relics of Luke at Constantinople and Padua.

Luke was a dear friend of the apostle Paul, and is mentioned three times by him in his Letters. Paul describes him as 'the beloved physician' and in his second Letter to Timothy, as his only companion in prison. He is believed to be the author of two books of the New Testament, firstly the gospel which stands in his name and also the *Acts of the Apostles*. Luke's narrative of the life of Christ has a pictorial quality and shows the sequential pattern from the nativity through to the death and resurrection. The developed sense of theology that comes over in Paul's writings is virtually unknown in those of Luke but, as a Gentile, Luke makes clear that the good news of salvation is for all, regardless of gender, social position or nationality. Traditionally, Luke wrote his gospel in Greece and died in Boeotia at the age of eighty-four.

All Souls Day: The annual All Souls Commemoration of the Faithful Departed falls this year on Monday 2nd November (which is also Cup Eve.) Please add the names of those whom you would like to be remembered at the altar to the list at the back of the church. Please note that there is no need to add names of those who were on the list from previous years – they have been kept and will be read at the Requiem Eucharist.

A Reading the second letter of Paul to Timothy

Do your best to come to me soon, for Demas, in love with this present world, has deserted me and gone to Thessalonica; Crescens has gone to Galatia, Titus to Dalmatia. Only Luke is with me. Get Mark and bring him with you, for he is useful in my ministry. I have sent Tychicus to Ephesus. When you come, bring the cloak that I left with Carpus at Troas, also the books, and above all the parchments. Alexander the coppersmith did me great harm; the Lord will pay him back for his deeds. You also must beware of him, for he strongly opposed our message.

At my first defence no one came to my support, but all deserted me. May it not be counted against them! But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. So I was rescued from the lion's mouth.

May your Word live in us, **and bear much fruit to your glory.**

A Reading from the Gospel according to Luke

✠ Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. He said to them,

‘The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, “Peace to this house!” And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the labourer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; cure the sick who are there, and say to them, “The kingdom of God has come near to you.”’

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**
