Reflections on today's Gospel

The secular world marks the ending and beginning of a new year with celebrations on New Year's Eve. On the spiritual journey we identify a new beginning with the season of Epiphany. It invites us to a personal recognition of Jesus; the embodiment of God with us.

The Baptism of our Lord reminds us that the Trinity has broken into our world and that we participate in that mystery every time we celebrate the Eucharist. Our challenge at the time of transition from one year to the next is to examine our relationship with God. If we have an earnest desire to strengthen and renew that relationship we need to set time aside for listening to the whisper of the Spirit.

It is in Liminal-space, the edge of what we have already known and experienced and what is yet to take shape that we encounter God's grace. It is not through our doing that we earn that grace. It is freely given and we approach that profound when we stop doing and allow ourselves to "be" in his presence.

I include a prayer adapted from Joyce Rupp's book *May I Have This Dance?* It is a wonderful encouragement for all of the ways that we are in transition and transformation at this time.

God of this new year, we are walking into mystery. We face the future not knowing what the days and months will bring us or how we will respond. Be love in us as we journey. May we welcome all who come our way. Deepen our faith to see all of life through your eyes. Fill us with hope and an abiding trust that you dwell in us amidst all our joys and sorrows. Thank you for our faith-life and for the assurance that you walk with us each day. God of this new year, we praise you. AMEN

A Reading from letter of the Acts of the Apostles

While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the inland regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. He said to them, 'Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?' They replied, 'No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit.' Then he said, 'Into what then were you baptized?' They answered, 'Into John's baptism.' Paul said, 'John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus.' On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. When Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied—altogether there were about twelve of them.

John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, 'The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.'

In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice

came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Henry Burton *There's a light upon the mountain.*

Henry Burton was born in 1840 at Swannington, Leicestershire, in the house where his grandmother, Mrs. James Burton, in 1818 organized the first Wesleyan juvenile missionary society.

His parents moved to America in his boyhood, he was educated at Beloit College, Wisconsin. After his graduation he became a local preacher in the Methodist Episcopal Church and acted as a supply for the brother of Miss Frances E. Willard and also for six months as pastor at Monroe, Wis.

He returned to England, and in 1865 entered the Wesleyan ministry. His labors have been chiefly in Lancashire and London. He married the sister of Rev. Mark Guy Pearse, the well-known Wesleyan preacher and author.

Burton is the author of the commentary on St. Luke in the Expositor's Bible series of commentaries and also of Gleanings in the Gospels and Wayside Songs, 1886. In 1900 he received the degree of Doctor of Divinity from Beloit College. His famous little poem titled "Pass It On" has been set to music by no less than ten different composers.

Burton died in 1930 at Charnwood, West Kirby, Birkenhead, Cheshire, England.
