**Bishop Graeme writes**: I am sorry that this will be my last Sunday at St Georges. I have very much enjoyed being the locum and the parish will be in my prayers as the search for a new vicar continues. Today's Gospel reading focuses on the call to discipleship.

One of the problems in reading the familiar story of the call of the first disciples is that it is easy to overlook its over-riding strangeness. We've heard the stories so often that we've lost the ability to be surprised by them. As someone has said, 'they have become like old coins, their edges smoothed away'.

When I was a student studying in Durham, I had the privilege going on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. For me, one of the most moving sights was our visit to Sea of Galilee. The lake is about 20 K's long and 13 K's wide, so on a clear day it is possible to see the whole lake from one side to the other. I remember standing there and looking out and saying to myself – 'Wow! Jesus saw this'! It was a bit like visiting a person's home and feeling that you know them better because you have seen where they live. May we all listen to today's Gospel with a determination to be Jesus' followers to the end.

The nets of those first fishermen-disciples speak powerfully of the need to let go of the things that entangle us from our past. I recently came across this prayer:

> Dear God, Please untie the knots that are in my mind, my heart and my life.

Remove the have nots, the can nots and the do nots that I have in my mind.

Erase the will nots, may nots, and might nots that find a home in my heart.

And most of all, dear God,
I ask that you remove from my mind,
my heart and my life all of the am nots
that I have allowed to hold me back,
especially the thought
that I am not good enough.
Amen.

## A Reading from the book of Jonah

The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time, saying, 'Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you.' So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, 'Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!' And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth.

When the news reached the king of Nineveh, he rose from his throne, removed his robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes. Then he had a proclamation made in Nineveh: 'By the decree of the king and his nobles: No human being or animal, no herd or flock, shall taste anything. They shall not feed, nor shall they drink water. Human beings and animals shall be covered with sackcloth, and they shall cry mightily to God. All shall turn from their evil ways and from the violence that is in their hands. Who knows? God may

relent and change his mind; he may turn from his fierce anger, so that we do not perish.'

When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them: and he did not do it.

May your Word live in us, and bear much fruit to your glory.
