Mayor Craig Langdon - a regular supporter - also attended. Cyril Thomas played for the singing of carols between the main and dessert courses. All in all in it was a most successful lunch with many of the regular guests stopping by the kitchen to express their thanks and also say they would miss the monthly get together. We finished the packing and final cleaning up at 3.30pm.
