Rosamond E. Herklots was born of British parents in North India in 1905. Educated at Leeds University in England, she worked for many years as secretary to an eminent neurologist, and later in the head office of the Association for Spina Bifida and Hydrocephalus in London. She began writing hymns late in life, and some achieved an immediate success. Herklots began writing poetry in her childhood and turned to hymn writing in her adult years. She wrote over seventy hymns, many specifically with children in mind.

She wrote today's hymn, "Forgive our sins as we forgive." The idea of the hymn had occurred to Miss Herklots when she was digging out weeds in her nephew's garden; she reasoned that their deep roots, obstructing the growth of the flowers near them, resembled the bitterness and resentment that can become entrenched and hinder the Christian's growth in grace.
