FIRST READING

GENESIS 18.1-15

A reading from the Book Genesis

The Lord appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. He said, 'My lord, if I find favour with you, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant.' So they said, 'Do as you have said.' And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah, and said, 'Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes.' Abraham ran to the herd, and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it. Then he took curds and milk and the calf

that he had prepared, and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree while they ate. They said to him, 'Where is your wife Sarah?' And he said, 'There, in the tent.' Then one said, 'I will surely return to you in due season, and your wife Sarah shall have a son.' And Sarah was listening at the tent entrance behind him. Now Abraham and Sarah were old, advanced in age; it had ceased to be with Sarah after the manner of women. So Sarah laughed to herself, saying, 'After I have grown old, and my husband is old, shall I have pleasure?' The Lord said to Abraham, 'Why did Sarah laugh, and say, "Shall I indeed bear a child, now that I am old?" Is anything too wonderful for the Lord? At the set time I will return to you, in due season, and Sarah shall have a son.' But Sarah denied, saying, 'I did not laugh'; for she was afraid. He said, 'Oh yes, you did laugh.'

SECOND READING

Romans 5.1-11

A reading from Paul's letter to the Romans

Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us. Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life. But more than that, we even boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION



GOSPEL MATTHEW 9.35-10.8

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according *to* Matthew. Glory to you, Lord Jes-*us* Christ.

Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest.' Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax-collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: 'Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, proclaim the good news, "The kingdom of heaven has come near." Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment.

Solar Power comes to St George's

We are grateful to Councillor Peter Castaldo for introducing us to the Montmorency Community Group and their Victorian State Government funded project to install solar panels on not-for-profit community buildings. Installation of 26kw of flat solar panels (70-80) on our roof (primarily the office building) will begin on or about 23 June 2020 for 4-5 days. It is estimated that we will use 20% of the power generated and supply the remainder to the grid. The sustainable impact of this project would see savings of 192% of CO2, SOx & NOx and 33 tons of CO2 emissions avoided per year. Over the system lifetime it is estimated that 981,158 car km will be avoided, which is the equivalent of planting 6,308 trees and avoiding 702 long haul flights.

We will enter into an agreement with the Montmorency Community Group to repay 10% of the project cost per annum for ten years, subject to our achieving the projected savings. This will enable other community (not-for-profit) groups to be the beneficiary of similar projects in the years ahead. We have assessed that we will be cash-flow positive from this project in FY 2020-21.

This is an exciting project and I am grateful to the Wardens and Vince for their ability to make themselves available at short notice for meetings, site meetings and decision making over a short time.

Furnitue - Church Layout

It is said among clergy of a particular vintage that you (the priest) should never move the times of the services, move the music or move the furniture. I have undertaken the latter, as an experiment, which means that furniture can be moved back or to other positions. The layout of the church now resembles the 1964 positions, which of themselves represent the traditional layout of a church with the pulpit on the left (Gospel) side of the church and the celebrant and lectern being on the right (Epistle) side of the church with the servers (as sanctuary servers) being sat on the left of the sanctuary. As I said an experiment.
