EXODUS 34.1-8

A reading from the Book Exodus

The Lord said to Moses, ‘Cut two tablets of stone like the former ones, and I will write on the tablets the words that were on the former tablets, which you broke. Be ready in the morning, and come up in the morning to Mount Sinai and present yourself there to me, on the top of the mountain. No one shall come up with you, and do not let anyone be seen throughout all the mountain; and do not let flocks or herds graze in front of that mountain.’ So Moses cut two tablets of stone like the former ones; and he rose early in the morning and went up on Mount Sinai, as the Lord had commanded him, and took in his hand the two tablets of stone. SECOND READING

2 CORINTHIANS 13.1-II


A reading from Paul's second letter to the Corinthians

This is the third time I am coming to you. 'Any charge must be sustained by the evidence of two or three witnesses.' I warned those who sinned previously and all the others, and I warn them now while absent, as I did when present on my second visit, that if I come again, I will not be lenient— since you desire proof that Christ is speaking in me. He is not weak in dealing with you, but is powerful in you. For he was crucified in weakness, but lives by the power of God. For we are weak in him, but in dealing with you we will live with him by the power of God. Examine yourselves to see whether you are living in the faith. Test yourselves. Do you not realize that Jesus Christ is in you?—unless, indeed, you fail to pass the test! I hope you will find out that we have not failed. But we pray to God that you may not do anything wrong—not that we may appear to have passed the test, but that you may do what is right, though we may seem to have failed. For we cannot do anything against the truth, but only for the truth. For we rejoice when we are weak and you are strong. This is what we pray for, that you may become perfect. So I write these things while I am away from you, so that when I come, I may not have to be severe in using the authority that the Lord has given me for building up and not for tearing down. Finally, brothers and sisters, farewell. Put things in order, listen to my appeal, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you.

It is hoped that social-distancing restrictions will have eased by then to the degree that we will be able to welcome quite a crowd to St Georges to celebrate a Choral Evensong in Noel's honour. Restoration Appeal to Celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Ordination to the Diaconate of the Rev'd Noel Whale

There are many aspects to the life and ministry of our former Vicar and friend Noel Whale; his love and compassion, sense of humour and generous hospitality, but also his ability to nudge us to 'give' in many different ways. During his tenure here at St George's his leadership led to the purchase and installation of our fine organ. He loved and still loves this church, as we all do, maybe we can make donations to restore and refurbish the fine wood furniture (pews and pulpit) that were donated by those who went before us, and some who thank goodness are still with us, as a tribute to his leadership and service. Letters of Appreciation

The parish have recently received letters of appreciation from Action for Peace and the Department of Defence (Army). These were for our support of the 2019 Christmas Bowl Appeal and our contribution to the Bush Fire Emergency through the service of the Vicar as a Defence Force Chaplain.

Solar Power comes to St George's

We are most grateful to Councillor Peter Castaldo for connecting us to the Montmorency Community Group and their Victorian State Government funded project to install solar panels on not-for-profit community buildings. Installation of 26kw of flat solar panels (70-80) on our roof (primarily the office building) will begin in the next few weeks. It is estimated, that based on historic, current and projected power usage that we will use 20% of the power generated and supply the remainder to the grid. The sustainable impact of this project would see savings of 192% of CO₂, SO_x & NO_x and 33 tons of CO₂ avoided per year. Over the system lifetime it is estimated that 981,158 car km will be avoided, equivalent of planting 6,308 trees and avoiding 702 long haul flights. We will enter into an agreement with the Montmorency Community Group to repay 10% of the project cost per annum for ten years, subject to our achieving the projected savings. This will enable other community (not-for-profit) groups to be the beneficiary of similar projects in the years ahead. We have assessed that we will be cash-flow positive from this project in FY 2020-21. This is an exciting project and I am grateful to the Wardens and Vince for their ability to make themselves available at short notice for meetings, site meetings and decision making over a short time.
