
A reading from Paul's Letter to James

My brothers and sisters, do you with your acts of favouritism really believe in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ? For if a person with gold rings and in fine clothes comes into your assembly, and if a poor person in dirty clothes also comes in, and if you take notice of the one wearing the fine clothes and say, 'Have a seat here, please', while to the one who is poor you say, 'Stand there', or, 'Sit at my feet', have you not made distinctions among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts? Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. Has not God chosen the poor in the world to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the kingdom that he has promised to those who love him? But you have dishonoured the poor. Is it not the rich who oppress you? Is it not they who drag you into court? Is it not they who blaspheme the excellent name that was invoked over you? You do well if you really fulfil the royal law according to the scripture, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' But if you show partiality, you commit sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it. For the one who said, 'You shall not commit adultery', also said, 'You shall not murder.' Now if you do not commit adultery but if you murder, you have become a transgressor of the law. So speak and so act as those who are to be judged by the law of liberty. For judgement will be without mercy to anyone who has shown no mercy; mercy triumphs over judgement. What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill', and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Mark.


Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

From there he set out and went away to the region of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice, but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, and she came and bowed down at his feet. Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophoenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. He said to her, 'Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs.' But she answered him, 'Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs.' Then he said to her, 'For saying that, you may go—the demon has left your daughter.' So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, and the demon gone Then he returned from the region of Tyre, and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. Then looking

up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, 'Ephphatha', that is, 'Be opened.' And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. They were astounded beyond measure, saying, 'He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord, praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.

Re-imagining the Future

'Re-imagining the future' is an initiative of the Anglican Diocese of Melbourne, developed by the Anglican Diocese of Melbourne as a resource to enable the local church (parishes), clergy, Wardens and Parish Council to consider the question of our future by discussing a range of scenarios that are possible and perhaps likely.

Our Parish Council met on Saturday 28 August 2021 to journey through the process of 're-imagining the future'. A report will be shared by email in the pew bulletin over the next few weeks.

Mission Giving - Parish Partnerships

The meeting of Parish Council of 15 August 2021 resolved to continue to support our extant prayer and partners in mission. They are:

- 1. The Sorted youth community in Bradford, UK
- 2. The Anglican Board of Mission Australia
- 3. Anglican Overseas Aid
- 4. The Mission to Seafarers Victoria
- 5. Open House Christian Involvement Centre Macleod

We are also exploring ways in which we can seek to deepen our connections with our mission partners, so that we might have the opportunity to impact our collective spirituality.

A reminder also that through our Opportunity Shop we support around 23-25 local not-for-profit non-government organisations in our local area.

Mission Giving - Parish Partnerships - Montmorency Community Group

In July 2020 we partnered with the Montmorency Community Group to access funding from the State Government of Victoria's Pick a project program. This funding enabled us to install phase 1 of 2 of our urban solar farm projects. To date the savings from our solar panels have been significant. As part of our partnership with Montmorency Community Group we committed to donating 10% of the original project cost (phase 1) to them so that they may continue to install solar panels on other local community buildings so that they too may benefit in the way that we have. I'm pleased to report that our contribution to Montmorency Community Group in 2021 will assist with the installation of solar panels on a community HUB in Montmorency and at "3081 Angels" at Olympic Village. Interestingly, we also support "3081 Angels" through our Opportunity Shop. The quantum of this overall project is significant in that "88 kw panels have now been installed, generating over 100, 000 Kwh a year. This corresponds to the power requirements of 30 homes. Over the next 10 years, they will double the amount of solar panels installed via the project."

2021 EVENSONG PROGRAM

26 September 2021

Theme: Celebration of the 50th anniversary in 1971 of the ordination of the Revd Noel Whale, a former incumbent of St George's. Fr Noel will preach the sermon. The Archbishop of Melbourne, the Most Reverend Dr Philip Freier, will be in attendance.

Theme: HRH Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, b. 10 June, 1921. Speaker: Professor David Flint AM, national convener of Australians for Constitutional Monarchy.

28 November 2021 - Advent

Theme: Michael Praetorius (Renaissance composer) b.1571. Presentation of music of Praetorius and commentary on his life and influence by Peter Bandy, renowned musicologist and commentator, currently director (among other musical ensembles) of the Heidelberg Choral Society. St Cecilia (patron saint of Music), whose commemorative day is 22 November, will be recognised in music.

Theme: Robin Boyd (architect) d.1971. A presentation of the architectural history of the church by Tony Lee, former executive director of the Robin Boyd Foundation.
