A reading from Paul's second letter to the Thessalonians

As to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered together to him, we beg you, brothers and sisters, not to be quickly shaken in mind or alarmed, either by spirit or by word or by letter, as though from us, to the effect that the day of the Lord is already here. Let no one deceive you in any way; for that day will not come unless the rebellion comes first and the lawless one is revealed, the one destined for destruction. He opposes and exalts himself above every so-called god or object of worship, so that he takes his seat in the temple of God, declaring himself to be God. Do you not remember that I told you these things when I was still with you?


But we must always give thanks to God for you, brothers and sisters beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the first fruits for salvation through sanctification by the Spirit and through belief in the truth. For this purpose he called you through our proclamation of the good news, so that you may obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. So then, brothers and sisters, stand firm and hold fast to the traditions that you were taught by us, either by word of mouth or by our letter.

Now may our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who loved us and through grace gave us eternal comfort and good hope, comfort your hearts and strengthen them in every good work and word.



Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to him and asked him a question, 'Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. Now there were seven brothers; the first married, and died childless; then the second and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her.' Jesus said to them, 'Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage; but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. Indeed they cannot die any more, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. Now he is God not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all of them are alive.' Then some of the scribes answered, 'Teacher, you have spoken well.' For they no longer dared to ask him another question.

After a few brief hours of sleep, I was able to enjoy the joyful gathering that was the Strawberry Fair at St Pauls, followed by two candlelight concerts at St Georges which drew full houses, as they apparently did on Friday evening. Sunday was also a joyous day as we gave thanks to God for the ministry of Fr Daniel Bol Nyieth who had taken services on Sundays

whilst I was away, and we also welcomed a good crowd to Jazz Vespers in the early evening. The study tour was an overwhelmingly positive experience, with many wonderful hosts, and generous colleagues, who shared in their experiences of the presence of God in their respective contexts. Study Tour 2022 - Quick Wins - Prayer Group for Growth

In 2019 at St Georges, we included for many months a prayer for growth in our pew bulletin, and unsurprisingly we grew. Through COVID that prayer disappeared from the pew bulletin. I have re-introduced the prayer (see above) and now invite us all to utilise that prayer in our daily devotions, but also extend the invitation to the people of both churches to form a prayer group for growth that might meet weekly, in person, online or at church or in family home to pray for growth in both communities.

Study Tour 2022 - Quick Wins - Vision - Lighting a candle

The study tour provided the opportunity to revisit church growth research, and the practical implications of implementing the research evidence found in growing healthy mission-shaped communities. A tip, which we could easily implement, rather than saving the Paschal candle for feasts, festivals and other holy days, each week we invite a member of our worshipping community to light the candle and articulate their vision for our respective communities. This could be done at the beginning of the service or immediately before the Greeting of Peace. Please join us in this small but important step.

Study Tour 2022 – Quick Wins – Opening Church – Welcoming People In 2019 St Georges participated in Open House Melbourne for the very first time. A number of visitors remarked "I didn't know that you were still open" or words to that effect. A reminder, as the research shows, that people need to know who we are, where we are, and that they are welcome. Over the last year we have experimented with being open at St Georges, and again unsurprisingly, we have discovered that people wander in to look around, for silent prayer, and for brief and not so brief conversations.

How might we open both our churches on a regular basis? The provision of simple hospitality, a coffee machine and good company so the evidence suggests works. Why don't we just do this as quickly as we can?
