

FIRST READING

Acts 10.34-43

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Then Peter began to speak to them: 'I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ - he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'


A reading from Paul's letter to the Colossians

SERMON

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the
forgiveness of sins.
We look for + the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.

RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

The Celebrant invites each member of the congregation to renew their own baptismal vows.

As we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead, we remember that through the Paschal mystery we also have died and been buried with him in baptism, so that we may rise with him to new life within the family of his Church.

Now that we have completed our observance of Lent, we renew the

promises made at our baptism, affirming our allegiance to Christ and our rejection of all that is evil.

Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of the bread, and in the prayers?

All I will, with God's help.

Will you persevere in resisting evil, and whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

All I will, with God's help.

Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

All I will, with God's help.

Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

All I will, with God's help.

Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

All I will, with God's help.


