SENTENCE

There is one Body and one Spirit; there is one hope in God's call to us. One Lord, one Faith, one Baptism, one God and Father of all. The Rev'd Kristen Dillon says.

Baptism is the gift of our Lord Jesus Christ.

When he had risen from the dead, he commanded his followers to go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

We have come together today to obey that command.

Baptism with water signifies the cleansing from sin that Jesus' death makes possible, and the new life that God gives us through the Holy Spirit. In baptism, the promises of God are visibly signed and sealed for us. We are joined to Christ, and made members of his body, the Church universal. Children are baptised in response to God's all-embracing love. Parents and godparents who have responded to that love come now to bring their children for baptism. Before this congregation they must express their own trust and commitment to the promises of God, and their intention to bring up their children in the faith and practice of the Church. In due time these children should make their own response to God.

So we welcome you, Kate and Alex and Sally, with your sponsors and godparents and families.

We give thanks for you, and pray that you may know God's love and faithfulness for ever.

A reading from Paul's first epistle to the Thessalonians

Now concerning love of the brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anyone write to you, for you yourselves have been taught by God to love one another; and indeed you do love all the brothers and sisters throughout Macedonia. But we urge you, beloved, to do so more and more, to aspire to live quietly, to mind your own affairs, and to work with your hands, as we directed you, so that you may behave properly towards outsiders and be dependent on no one.

But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those who have died, so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died. For this we declare to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will by no means precede those who have died. For the Lord himself, with a cry of command, with the archangel's call and with the sound of God's trumpet, will descend from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air; and so we will be with the Lord for ever. Therefore encourage one another with these words.

We welcome *Kate and Alex and Sally* who come to be baptised. I invite *Michael and Stephanie and Toby and Helen* to present them now.

The sponsors answer

We present Kate and Alex and Sally to be baptised.

Kristen says

Toby and Michael, Will you accept the responsibilities placed upon you in bringing Alex for baptism?

I will.

Are you willing to answer on behalf of Alex?

I am.

By your own prayers and example, by your friendship and love, will you encourage Alex in the life and faith of the Christian community?

I will, with God's help.

THE DECISION

Kristen says to the candidates able to answer for themselves, and to the sponsors of other candidates

In Baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore,

Before God and this congregation, you must affirm that you turn to Christ and reject all that is evil:

Do you turn to Christ?

I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins?

I repent of my sins.

Do you reject selfish living, and all that is false and unjust?

I reject them all.

Do you renounce Satan and all evil?

I renounce all that is evil.

Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light of Christ to his everlasting kingdom. Amen.

Kristen says to the candidates and sponsors

Will you each, Kate and Michael, Stephanie and Alex, Sally and Toby and Helen, by God's grace, strive to live as a disciple of Christ, loving God with your whole heart, and your neighbour as yourself, until your life's end?

I will, with God's help.

Kristen says to the congregation

You have heard these our brothers and sisters respond to Christ. Will you support them in this calling?

The congregation answers

We will.

Kristen says

Let us pray.

Grant, merciful God, that Kate, Alex and Sally may be so buried with Christ in baptism that the new nature may be raised up in them. May the fruit of your Spirit grow and flourish in them. **Amen.**

Give to their sponsors and their families the desire to share with them what you have revealed in your holy gospel. **Amen.**

May they know Christ's forgiving love and continue in the fellowship and service of his Church. May they proclaim, by word and example, the good news of God in Christ. **Amen.**

We thank you for the ministry we have in your world and to each other in the household of faith. Hasten that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in Christ. **Amen.**

THE BAPTISM

The Rev'd Kristen leaves the canditates to the font and continues.

We give you thanks that at the beginning of creation your Holy Spirit moved upon the waters to bring forth light and life. With water you cleanse and replenish the earth; you nourish and sustain all living things.

Thanks be to God.

We give you thanks that through the waters of the Red Sea you led your people out of slavery into freedom, and brought them through the river Jordan to new life in the land of promise.

Thanks be to God.

We give you thanks for your Son Jesus Christ: for his baptism by John, for his anointing with the Holy Spirit.

Thanks be to God.

We give you thanks that through the deep waters of death Jesus delivered us from our sins and was raised to new life in triumph.

Thanks be to God.

We give you thanks for the grace of the Holy Spirit who forms us in the likeness of Christ and leads us to proclaim your kingdom.

Thanks be to God.

Kristen continues

And now we give you thanks that you have called Kate and Alex and Sally to new birth in your Church through the waters of baptism.

Pour out your Holy Spirit in blessing and sanctify this water so that those who are baptised in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection. May they die to sin, rise to newness of life, and continue for ever in Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we give you praise and honour in the unity of the Spirit, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Kristen says to the candidates able to answer for themselves, and to the sponsors of other candidates.

Let us all affirm with Kate and Sally, the faith of the Church. Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in God the Son?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Kristen says to the congregation

This is the faith of the Church.

The congregation responds

This is our faith:

We believe in one God:

Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Each candidate is brought to the water.

The Rev'd Kristen baptises by pouring water over them saying

Kate, I baptise you in the name of the Father,

and of the Son,

Amen.

and of the Holy Spirit.

And each one of them answers with their sponsors and the congregation

Alex, I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

And each one of them answers with their sponsors and the congregation

Amen.

Sally, I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

And each one of them answers with their sponsors and the congregation

Amen.

AFTER BAPTISM

When all have been baptised, the Kristen takes the chrism oil and makes a cross on the forehead of each person, saying

Kate, I sign you with the sign of the cross to show that you are marked as Christ's own for ever.

Alex, I sign you with the sign of the cross to show that you are marked as Christ's own for ever.

Sally, I sign you with the sign of the cross to show that you are marked as Christ's own for ever.

Kristen addresses all the newly baptised

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church, pour upon you the riches of his grace, that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit, and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory.

Amen.

Live as a disciple of Christ: fight the good fight, finish the race, keep the faith.

and the congregation responds, saying

Confess Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, look for his coming in glory.

Kristen gives a lighted candle to each person saying

Kate, Sally, Alex: God has brought you out of darkness into his marvellous light.

The congregation joins the minister saying

Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Father.

Kristen continues

God has called you into his Church.

The congregation joins the minister in saying

We therefore receive and welcome you, Kate, Alex and Sally as members with us of the body of Christ, as children of the one heavenly Father, and as inheritors of the kingdom of God.

THE GREETINGS OF PEACE

All stand. The Greeting of Peace is introduced with these words.

In baptism, God has made us one in Christ.

His Spirit is with us.

Kristen says

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

And also with you.

All may exchange a sign of peace.
